При проверка на задачите с кратък свободен отговор не се вземат предвид правописни и граматически грешки. В отговора се оценява съответствието между информацията в него с тази в текста.

Sample Answers

№ 31. Where did the action take place?

Примерен отговор: The action took place in New York. (2 p.) [It started on Twenty-Third Street of New York and continued in Greenwich Village. (2 p.)]

№ 32. Why were the two thieves nicknamed ‘The Diner Bandits’?

Примерен отговор: The two thieves/ They were called/nicknamed ‘The Diner Bandits’ because they [had] robbed nine restaurants in two hours.(2 p.)

№ 33. How were the police able to identify the thieves’ car?

Примерен отговор: Some witnesses [who were quick to understand what was happening] contacted the police and sent them the licence plate number of the thieves’ car. (2 p.)

№ 34. What was Barry MacDonald’s reaction when he first saw Spider-Man?

Примерен отговор: When Barry MacDonald first saw Spider-Man, [his pulse started racing (1p. *for copied answer*)] / his heart started beating with excitement / he was very / extremely excited. (2 p.)

№ 35. How do New Yorkers feel about Spider-Man’s involvement in the incident?

Примерен отговор: Many New Yorkers feel grateful for / admire what Spider-Man did (1 p.) because he was there/ he appeared when he was [most] needed. (1 p.)

Listening Comprehension

Task One

You will hear a text twice. Before you listen to it for the first time, you have 25 seconds to read the tasks to the text. While listening for the first time you are not allowed to mark your chosen answers. After you listen to it for the first time, you have 25 seconds to mark your chosen answers on your answer sheet. While listening to the text for a second time, you can mark your chosen answers. After you listen to the text for the second time, you have 25 seconds more to check or correct your answers.

A series of festivals, also known as the “carnival season”, began in Germany this Thursday. German people refer to the celebrations as “the fifth season”. This year, however, they are under strict Covid-19 restrictions, because of a rise in new infections.

Claire Brown (C.B.): With us today is Dan Johnson, a long-time advocate for dog rescue who has fostered a number of dogs as they have waited for a forever home. Mr Johnson, you have just made another dog’s dream come true. Can you tell us about that?

Dan Johnson (D. J.): Yes, this was amazing. We had a very special case where a dog was flown up from Puerto Rico, his name was Frankie and he was a six-month-old Shepherd mix, and he needed to be delivered to his forever home in Massachusetts, so a travel agency partnered with me, and we were able to find the right dog-friendly stops along the way. It was a fantastic experience.

C.B.: There was a recent survey about taking pets on road trips. Can you tell us about some of its findings?

D.J.: Yeah, the findings were quite interesting. Seventy-seven percent of the respondents said they planned to take their pets along with them on the road this summer. This clearly shows that

we consider dogs as members of the family and we are trying to include them in all our experiences.

C.B.: And what would be a good trip that we can take with our dogs on the American West Coast?

D.J.: I'd definitely recommend the Pacific Road trip, you can go from Oregon all the way to Seattle, and the best thing about this trip is that there are many stops along the way: the stops are just about two hours from each other, so it's going to be really dog-friendly.

C.B.: What else, do you think, we should consider when travelling with our pets?

D.J.: Well, safety is another important factor. Make sure your dog is properly secured in the car, and that it has all its needs met. If your dog is on any medicines, make sure it has the right treats, food, chew toys, its favourite bed, its favourite stuffed animals.

C.B.: And finally, Mr Johnson, would you share with us any tips on how to prepare our dogs before we go on a trip?

D.J.: The best tip is to get them started on short trips first, make sure they associate the car with positive experiences. Start with a trip around town, take them to a dog park or a pet store to pick out a favourite toy and then take them back home – start building from there... [*sound fading*].
